Aside from discussing the novel, the kids were very generous in sharing details about life in their area – I even learnt some phrases in Creole! They were curious about life in Los Angeles and also Scotland (where I'm originally from). We exchanged some pictures and it was nice for me to visualize them in their classroom.
